November Spotlight – Justice for Women Program

Justice infuses Scripture, from the Hebrew prophets to Jesus' parables and life. Broadly speaking, biblical justice concerns the integrity of the entire creation. The ELCA recognizes that the integrity of women and girls is constantly violated and/or compromised, physically, intellectually, economically, spiritually and emotionally. "Justice for women" matters because through God's grace we are called to tend to women and girls and anyone who is gender-marginalized as our neighbors. The ELCA also recognizes that tending to our neighbors includes not only immediate needs, such as food, shelter and safety, but also changes in social and religious ideas and structures.

December Spotlight – Lifelong Faith Formation

For many, baptism marks us with the cross of Christ on our brows for the first time. In the Lutheran church children and adults are brought to a font in a public gathering to recognize God's claim upon their lives, which begins a lifelong journey of the Spirit sending them out in mission for the sake of the world. And since it is a lifelong journey of faith, often called faith formation, people enter into Christian community through baptism at various ages and stages in life. The ELCA seeks to focus on intergenerational lifelong faith formation of Christian communities, marked, claimed, gathered and sent.



Two Pianists Saturday September 16 | 7:30pm



Notes from the Poconos

On Monday, September 25, Phil Bernal, Raul and I left Chicago in our Budget Truck at midnight and traveled to South Bend, Indiana the first night. We got up Tuesday morning and had breakfast and started our second day and traveled to western Penna and stopped to rest and recharge for our third day. We got to Wilkes-Barre and spent our third night there. On Thursday morning we traveled to the Hawley area and checked into the Tuck'em Inn in Hawley, PA. On Friday morning I had my closing on my new home. In the afternoon I recruited two local guys to help unload the truck. On Saturday morning we went back to Wilkes-Barre to load up the storage locker which had all of my mom's things. I forgot how much was there -- but some nice bedroom furniture and a good lazy boy rocker. We brought these treasures and put most in my garage. I just love my new home in Grampa's Woods. We've some deer and heard the bear one night. Phil returned to Chicago on Monday, October 2nd and Raul left Thursday October 5th on Amtrak train. I attended church (St Paul's Hawley, PA.) on Sunday and made the pistachio cake, which was a big hit with the congregation. The one man, Willy, asked if I could make it every week -- but I told him I have a variety of recipes. So here's the recipe for the Pistachio cake:

In large mixing bowl put 1 yellow cake mix, 1 pkg of pistachio pudding, 4 eggs, 1 cup chopped walnuts, 1 cup soda water, 1/2 cup of Wesson oil. Beat til all is mixed. Take 10 inch tube pan, grease and flour. Put mix into tube pan and bake at 350 degree oven for 45-50 minutes. Allow cake to cool. Take pint of whipping cream and add one pkg of pistachio pudding mix. Mix and frost cake. Enjoy the baking!!
